the pioneer group of the düsseldorf school the düsseldorf school has become a household name in the art world for one of the most successful and influential strains of modern photography coined in the late 1980s the name refers mainly to the pioneer group of students of the late bernd becher who in 1976 became the first professor for creative photography at a german arts academy his

students included andreas gursky candida h fer axel hütte thomas ruff and thomas struth all of them today internationally acclaimed artists in their own right whereas düsseldorf school initially was used as a handy term for a group of artists with the same university s background it quickly turned into a powerful brand name both in critical and commercial contexts despite its welcomed impact on the art scene the members of the school felt rather ambiguous about their perception as a group which turned them into stars but simultaneously risked levelling individual profiles and differences what exactly connects and distinguishes them aesthetically is for the first time thoroughly explored in maren polte s pioneering study

this book offers a groundbreaking exploration of the pervasive issue of gender based violence gbv within the realms of art and cultural production this collection of essays delves into both the overt and subtle forms of gbv it spans sexual harassment assault and the everyday sexism ingrained in creative workplaces and art schools in both professional and private dimensions the book covers a wide array of artistic sectors opera visual arts music and theatre across diverse global contexts from europe to asia and north america by incorporating feminist and sociological theories the essays not only examine the structural power dynamics that perpetuate gbv but also highlight efforts to challenge and dismantle these systems the book addresses both criminal acts of violence and the ordinary forms of sexism that pervade artistic spaces making visible the normalized patterns of behavior that maintain gender inequality the volume is divided into three parts the production of gbv its representations in cultural work and the initiatives to counteract it a crucial contribution to ongoing discussions of workplace and educational inequality this timely volume fills a notable gap in research on gender based violence within the arts its methodological rigor and international perspective ensure that it will serve as a key resource for scholars practitioners and advocates alike

an invaluable resource for photography educators this volume is a survey of photographic education in the first decade of the 21st century drawing upon her 25 years of teaching experience and her professional network michelle bogre spoke with 47 photo educators from all over the world to compile this diverse set of interviews the themes of these conversations explore why students should study photography the value of a formal photography degree teaching philosophies whether video and multimedia should be an essential part

of a photographic curricula the challenges of teaching photography today changes in photographic education overall the second half of the book shares 70 photography assignments of varying level of difficulty from these educators some paired with examples of how students completed them this book will inspire and invigorate any photography educator s curriculum

jorma puranen born 1951 is one of finland s best known photographers for his latest series icy prospects inspired by the fascination of great explorers and today s tourists with the arctic landscape puranen painted a wooden board with black high gloss acrylic and then took long exposures of the landscapes mirrored in its surface the results are extremely painterly impressions of nature in which ground brushstroke and reflection intermingle
