accompanying over seventy readings the anthology reveals the multifaceted societies and political systems of the Islamic world. Selections range from theological texts illuminating the differences between Shi'ite and Sunni Muslims to diplomatic exchanges and state papers to memoirs and literary works to manifestos of Islamic radicals. This newly revised and expanded edition covers the dramatic changes in the region since 2005 and the popular uprisings that swept from Tunisia in January 2011 through Egypt, Libya and beyond. The *Middle East and Islamic World Reader* is a fascinating historical survey of complex societies that now more than ever are crucial for us to understand. Ambitious and timely, the work it focuses mainly on sociopolitical texts dating from the rise of Islam to the debates concerning U.S. foreign policy in the post 9/11 world choice.

The pervasiveness of these influences makes it clear that they will continue to shape political and economic relations, migration patterns, the dissemination of knowledge and radials of Islamic militancy for a long time to come.
