belief in god answers two questions what if anything is it that jews christians and muslims are agreeing about when they join in claiming that there is a god and what if any prospects are there for rationally defending or attacking this claim in the context of a sustained argument for particular answers to these questions tim mawson tackles many of the most prominent topics in the philosophy of religion he argues that those who believe that there

is a god are best interpreted as believing that there is a being who is essentially personal transcendent immanent omnipotent omniscient eternal perfectly free perfectly good and necessary and non essentially creator of the world and value revealer of himself and offerer of everlasting life having explored the meaning and consistency of this conception of god in the first half of the book mawson goes on to consider whether or not belief or the absence of belief in such a god might be the sort of thing that does not rationally require argument and if not what the criteria for a good argument for or against such a god s existence might be having established some criteria he uses them to evaluate specific arguments for and against the existence of such a god he looks at the argument to design the cosmological argument the ontological argument the argument from religious experience the argument from apparent miracles the problem of evil and pascal s wager finally he explores the relationbetween faith and reason in the course of his argument mawson makes striking new claims and defends or attacks established positions in new ways his conversational style lively wit and enlightening examples make belief in god as pleasurable as it is instructive and thought provoking it makes an ideal text for beginning undergraduate courses and for anyone thinking about these most important of questions

the questions to which this book addresses itself were first put to me in a philosophically rigorous way by john and he was the first to guide me to care about trying to answer them in a similar fashion anybody who is familiar with the work of richard will recognize his influence on almost every page of this book on starting points we are often in complete agreement on conclusions less so

this is a clear and concise and original investigation of god s nature and existence first of all it considers among other things two of god s traditional properties being all knowing and being all powerful it argues he cannot possess these properties but it argues this is in accord with him being worthy of worship secondly it introduces the notion of evil being overridden it argues he has to bring about other free living things and it is plausible they have to be liable to experience evil due to their conditions but it argues the evil in this world is overridden thirdly it considers the principal arguments for the claim he does not exist they refer to the evil in the world it argues they do not establish sufficient grounds for this claim finally it considers some well known arguments for the claim he exists it argues they face difficulties it sets out other arguments eg some arguments to increase any degree of belief one has that god can exist it includes a number of appendices god s sovereignty are there sufficient grounds for the claim that very probably god does not exist

theodicy and some theodicies some further remarks on god and time some further remarks on a living thing which possesses the power to do this or that freely some remarks on god being simple some remarks on god being present in a spatial realm and god being present in a non spatial realm it covers as a whole the principal parts of the philosophy of religion it unifies these parts to a significant degree it proceeds regularly by way of formal and clear arguments it will be of interest to advanced students and specialists in philosophy religious studies and theology given its explanation of key terms its jargon free language its clarity and brevity it will be of interest to others too

in today s secular world the christian faith is viewed as only one aspect of what could be called religious life acknowledging this hendrikus berkhof begins this thought provoking study with a sketch of religion and faith in general before narrowing it down to a discussion of the specific place of christian faith in all of reality
