paradoxes have become characteristic of the world we live in poverty and privilege
empire and oppression migration and enclaves seeking war and peace justice and

injustice reconciliation and revenge during the 2016 *societas homiletica* annual conference held in south africa these paradoxes served as a rediscovery of the calling of preachers to deliver the promise that lies within life s contradictions a divine promise brought forth by the grace of god and the gospel of christ embodied in and through us by the spirit of christ this promise may take many forms and calls for discernment and often interrupts the status quos in surprising shocking ways it is a promise that interrupts in order to comfort

leading to paradoxical propositions that a finite distance cannot be traversed by a moving object that a faster runner cannot overtake a slower one that an arrow flight is at rest that half a given time is equal to the whole these paradoxes were intended as support for the doctrine of parmenides that all apparent motion is illusory and of the attempts that have been made to show wherein they are fallacious none has met with universal acceptance in this work solutions are suggested for the first three paradoxes there is an exposition of the atomic theory of space and time which has been thought to underlie the fourth and attempts which some commentators have made to explain the fourth on that basis are examined
