the routledge companion to science fiction is a comprehensive overview of the history and study of science fiction it outlines major writers movements and texts in the genre established critical approaches and areas for future study fifty six entries by a team of renowned international contributors are divided into four parts which look in turn at history an integrated chronological narrative of the genre's development theory detailed accounts of major theoretical

approaches including feminism marxism psychoanalysis cultural studies postcolonialism posthumanism and utopian studies issues and challenges anticipates future directions for study in areas as diverse as science studies music design environmentalism ethics and alterity subgenres a prismatic view of the genre tracing themes and developments within specific subgenres bringing into dialogue the many perspectives on the genre the routledge companion to science fiction is essential reading for anyone interested in the history and the future of science fiction and the way it is taught and studied

by examining important aspects of science fiction in the twentieth century this book explains how the genre evolved to its current state close critical attention is given to topics including the art that has accompanied science fiction the subgenres of space opera and hard science fiction the rise of sf anthologies and the burgeoning impact of the marketplace on authors included are in depth studies of key texts that contributed to science fiction s growth including philip francis nowlan s first buck rogers story the first published stories of a e van vogt and the early juveniles of isaac asimov arthur c clarke and robert heinlein

this book provides students and other interested readers with a comprehensive survey of science fiction history and numerous essays addressing major science fiction topics authors works and subgenres written by a distinguished scholar this encyclopedia deals with written science fiction in all of its forms not only novels and short stories but also mediums often ignored in other reference books such as plays poems comic books and graphic novels some science fiction films television programs and video games are also mentioned particularly when they are relevant to written texts its focus is on science fiction in the english language though due attention is given to international authors whose works have been frequently translated into english since science fiction became a recognized genre and greatly expanded in the 20th century works published in the 20th and 21st centuries are most frequently discussed though important earlier works are not neglected the texts are designed to be helpful to numerous readers ranging from students first encountering science fiction to experienced scholars in the field
