in 1968 university of california press published an unusual manuscript by an anthropology student named carlos castaneda. He speaks of his encounters with mescalito, a teaching spirit inhabiting all peyote plants; divination with lizards by using a hallucinogenic powder rubbed on his temples to understand their language; and flying in animal form using the devil's weed, the datura plant. The second, a structural analysis, is an attempt castaneda says at disclosing the internal cohesion and the cogency of don juan's teachings. 1.
