this set includes all four books of the heroines behind the lines series wedded to war widow of gettysburg yankee in atlanta and spy of richmond the heroines behind the lines series highlights the crucial contributions made by women during the civil war in wedded to war charlotte chooses a life of service over privilege just as her childhood friend had done when he became a military doctor she soon discovers that she s combatting more than just the rebellion by becoming a nurse will the two men who love her simply stand by and watch as she fights her own battles or will their desire for her wage war on her desire to serve god in widow of gettysburg the farm of union widow liberty holloway is disfigured into a confederate field hospital bringing her face to face with unspeakable suffering and a confederate scout who awakens her long dormant heart will liberty be defined by the tragedy in her life or will she find a way to triumph over it in yankee in atlanta soldier caitlin mckae wakes up in atlanta after being wounded in battle the georgian doctor who treated her believed caitlin s only secret was that she had been fighting for the confederacy disguised as a man to avoid arrest or worse caitlin hides her true identity and makes a new life for herself in atlanta when sherman s troops edge closer to atlanta caitlin tries to escape north but is arrested on charges of being a spy will honor dictate that caitlin follow the rules or love demand that she break them in spy of richmond union loyalist sophie kent attempts to end the war from within the confederate capital but she can't do it alone as sophie's spy network grows she walks a tightrope of deception using her father's position as newspaper editor and a suitor's position in the ordnance bureau when her espionage endangers the people she loves she's forced to make a life and death gamble

louis auchincloss recently hailed as a psychologist social observer and historian rolled into one combines all three roles yet again to bring us a unique collection of literary essays with all the wisdom and mastery he brings to his fiction he profiles the life and work of twenty three diverse and talented authors ranging from such masters as henry james to those less well known such as ivy compton burnett and dumas fils chosen not for their popularity but for their impact on auchincloss himself the writers profiled here make up an important installment in literary history the man behind the book is one of auchincloss s most engaging and personal works to date essential to auchincloss s loyal followers and a rare treat for fans of literary history the man behind the book offers a wealth of delights from the pen of one of the most distinguished prolific and entertaining standard bearers of american letters

this powerful and timely book written by a former fundamentalist is a thorough critique of the popular fundamentalist notion of the rapture the belief that christians will be removed from earth prior to a time of tribulation and the second coming it examines the theological historical and biblical basis for premillennial dispensationalism the belief system based around the rapture and popularized in the best selling left behind books and taught by bible prophecy writers tim lahaye hal lindsey jack van impe and many others written for both the lay person and the serious student this book combines an engaging popular approach with detailed footnotes and exhaustive research beginning with the big picture it focuses first on key concepts such as eschatology the parousia and the relationship between the kingdom and the church it then examines the book of revelation providing insights into the nature and purpose of that difficult final book of the bible another chapter looks at the concept of the millennium and how it has been understood by various christians over the centuries olson then shows how left behind creator lahaye\s many works on bible prophecy are filled with attacks on catholicism and often rely on sensationalism shaky scholarship and subjective interpretations of scripture olson a former dispensationalist who now edits envoy magazine also presents a history of apocalyptic belief and theology beginning with the early church fathers and including the montanists st augustine joachim of fiore the protestant reformers and the american puritans he shows how john nelson darby an ex anglican priest developed the premillennial dispensationalist system which hinges on the rapture in the 1830s and how darby relied upon faulty assumptions about jesus christ the church and the bible the second part of the book a catholic critique of dispensationalism focuses on three important topics the relationship between israel the church and the kingdom the interpretation of scripture and the nature of the rapture event filled with a wealth of information drawn from both protestant and catholic sources this section provides a complete rebuttal to the premillennial dispensationalist system and the left behind theology the book concludes with a reflection on the catholic understanding of the end times salvation history and the final judgement glossaries of key persons and terms are also included a strong but fair critique of a dangerous and popular belief will catholics be left behind provides catholics and protestants lay people and clergy and students and scholars with important answers and information about the roots and meaning of the rapture millions of americans believe the lord will snatch them up any day now leaving the rest of us to the horrors of a seven year tribulation the hitch is that the rapture has no pedigree as carl olson shows no catholic or protestant believed in it prior to the nineteenth century it is an authentic fundamentalist invention karl keating author catholicism and fundamentalism in this extraordinary book carl olson uses a surgeon\( \text{S} \) scalpel to cut through the mass of confusion that dominates contemporary reflection on the last things achieving far more than a refutation of millennialist errors and other disordered apocalyptic theories he illumines the church's majestic vision of time and

the popular left behind series by tim lahaye and jerry jenkins has sold more than 62 million copies since the first volume appeared in 1995 jerry falwell pronounced it the most important series of books in the history of modern christianity many readers have assumed it gives the true facts about the way the world will end and what will happen to all the people in it but according to real biblical scholarship this series is seriously flawed based on a misreading of many scriptures including daniel and the book of revelation it has fed a kind of hysteria in the christian populace that has led many people to reorder their existence in expectation of an impending doom and the sudden unexpected return of jesus in this book william powell tuck carefully and authoritatively refutes the premises and faulty theology of the left behind books critiquing them in the light of genuine biblical scholarship and common sense

truman capote once said the thing i like to do most in the whole world is talk and talk he does in the more than two dozen interviews collected in this book

the topics are often gossip about the famous people capote ran with but always he provides revealing information about his writings the authors who inspired him his meticulous methods of research and composition and his personal reverence for the craft of authorship he was as the editor notes fiercely devoted to his art and keenly aware of his place in the world of letters while his detractors such as ernest hemingway and gore vidal spoke out long and loud against the feisty and media minded writer from louisiana capote here has the last word what emerges is a portrait of the author as pop cult figure unabashed in his pursuit of fame and fortune but unstinting in his devotion to becoming one of america's major prose stylists these interviews range from the first he granted after the publication of his first novel through his shockingly personal self interview which appeared at the end of his last major work

it is the not too distant future and the rapture has occurred every born again christian on the planet has without prior warning been snatched from the earth to meet christ in the heavens while all those without the requisite faith have been left behind to suffer the wrath of the antichrist as the earth enters into its final days this is the premise that animates the enormously popular cultural phenomenon that is the left behind series of prophecy novels co written by tim lahaye and jerry jenkins and published between 1995 and 2007 but these books are more than fiction it is the sincere belief of many evangelicals that these events actually will occur soon plotting apocalypse delves into the world of rapture prophecy and tribulation in order to account for the extraordinary cultural salience of these books and the impact of the world they project through penetrating readings of the novels chapman shows how the series offers a new model of evangelical agency for its readership the novels teach that although believers are incapable of changing the course of a future that has been preordained by god they can become empowered by learning to read the prophetic books of the bible and the signs of the times correctly reading and interpretation become key indices of agency in the world that left behind limns plotting apocalypse reveals the significant cultural work that left behind performs in developing a counter narrative to the passivity and fatalism that can characterize evangelical prophecy belief chapman s arguments may bear profound implications for the future of american evangelicalism and its interactions with culture society and politics

the lord s supper or eucharist has often been a subject of intense debate in the church what is often lost in this debate is the significance of the relationship of the eucharist to jesus last supper with his disciples which was a passover or passover like meal moreover the last supper connects back to various meals in jesus earthly ministry and it looks forward to the great messianic banquet as fulfillment of jewish expectations in exploring these connections this book focuses on the three motifs of new creation hospitality and hope in christ most significantly when we break the bread and drink the wine or juice together we are asserting the reality of the new creation in christ affirming god s grace forgiveness and cruciform love which is to be embodied in the christian community and anticipating the day when god s present and ongoing work of restoration justice and reconciliation will ultimately prevail the supper then is basically a condensed summary of the story of god s plan of redemption hesselgrave brings together biblical theological ethical and social insights in a way that deepens our understanding of the meaning and practical significance of biblical texts related to this central ordinance of the church

an in depth analysis of an anti semitic conspiracy theory from its origins in the 20th century to its resurgence today the protocols of the elders of zion first

published in russia around 1905 claimed to be the captured secret protocols from the first zionist congress in basel in 1897 describing a plan by the jewish people to achieve global domination while the document has been proven to be fake much of it plagiarized from satirical anti semitic texts it had a major impact throughout europe during the first half of the 20th century particularly in germany after world war ii the text was further denounced anyone who referred to it as a genuine document was seen as an ignorant hate monger yet there is abundant evidence that the protocols is resurfacing in many places the paranoid apocalypse re examines the text s popularity investigating why it has persisted as well as larger questions about the success of conspiracy theories even in the face of claims that they are blatantly counterfactual and irrational it considers the medieval pre history of the protocols the conditions of its success in the era of early twentieth century secular modernity and its post holocaust avatars from the muslim world to walmart and left wing anti american radicalism contributors argue that the key to the protocols longevity is an apocalyptic paranoia that lays the groundwork not only for the myth s popularity but for its implementation as a vehicle for genocide and other brutal acts

things we left behind by lucy score things we left behind by lucy score is the final book in the knockemout series a compelling contemporary romance novel with elements of suspense and drama the story centers around two main characters lucian rollins and sloane walton whose complex relationship evolves amidst a backdrop of secrets personal quests and emotional turmoil lucian rollins is depicted as a lean mean vengeance seeking mogul determined to erase his father s dark legacy from their family name his life is consumed by his efforts to amass power and wealth which he believes are essential for his safety however his calm is disrupted by sloane walton a feisty small town librarian who challenges his worldviews and emotions sloane walton on the other hand is driven by a quest to carry on her father s pursuit of justice she is determined to uncover the truth about what lucian s father did to her family sloane and lucian share a complex history marked by a dark secret and mutual disdain yet there is an undeniable chemistry between them grab a copy and learn more

for the past twenty years evangelical prophecy novels have been a powerful presence on american bestseller lists emerging from a growing conservative culture industry the genre dramatizes events that many believers expect to occur at the end of the age the rapture of the saved the rise of the antichrist and the fearful tribulation faced by those who are left behind seeking the forces that drove the unexpected success of the left behind novels crawford gribben traces the gradual development of the prophecy fiction genre from its eclectic roots among early twentieth century fundamentalists the first rapture novels came onto the scene at the high water mark of protestant america from there the genre would both witness the defeat of conservative protestantism and participate in its eventual reconstruction and return providing for the renaissance of the evangelical imagination that would culminate in the left behind novels yet as gribben shows the rapture genre while vividly expressing some prototypically american themes also serves to greatly complicate the idea of american modernity assaulting some of its most cherished tenets gribben concludes with a look at post left behind rapture fiction noting some works that were written specifically to counter the claims of the best selling series along the way he gives attention not just to literary fictions but to rapture films and apocalyptic themes in christian music writing the rapture is an indispensable guide to this flourishing yet little understood body of
