hardbound the interrelationship of religion and tourism has barely been touched upon in scholarly research this book aims to present and analyze this relationship from sociological economic and anthropological perspectives the

religious tourist and categories of religiously motivated tourism are delineated and numerous contemporary issues worthy of attention and research are identified this provides insights into the relationship between tourism and religion suppression or encouragement of one by the other potential and actual conflicts their mutual casualty and impact the expression of religious feeling or freedom the touristic determinants of pilgrimages etc the author ends with his own observations and conclusions regarding the future of the relationship and its likely direction and development

jerusalem is a city with a singular nature home to three religions it contains spiritual meaning for people the world over it is at once a tourist destination and a location with a complex political reality tourism therefore is an integral part of jerusalem s development and its political conflicts the book traces tourism and pilgrimage to jerusalem from the late ottoman era through the british mandate during the period of the divided city and to the reunification of the city under israeli rule throughout the city s evolution is shown to be intertwined with its tourist industry as tourist sites accommodations infrastructure and services transform the city s structures and open spaces at the same time tourism is wielded by various parties in an effort to gain political recognition to bolster territorial control or to garner support the city s future and the role tourism can play in it are examined while the construction of a security fence will have many implications on jerusalem s tourist industry steps are proposed to minimize the effects of the security fence and optimize tourism written by leading academics this title will be valuable reading for students academics and researchers in the fields of tourism religious studies geography history cultural studies and anthropology

pilgrimage beyond the officially sacred understanding the geographies of religion and spirituality in sacred travel examines the many ways in which pilgrimage engages with sacredness delving beyond the officially recognized and often religiously conceived pilgrimage sites as scholarship examining the lived experiences of pilgrims and tourists has demonstrated pilgrimage need not be religious in nature nor be officially sanctioned rather they can be hyper meaningful voyages set apart from the everyday profane life in a word they are sacred separating the social category of religion from the sacred this volume brings together a multidisciplinary group of scholars employing perspectives

from anthropology geography sociology religious studies theology and interdisciplinary tourism studies to theorize sacredness its variability and the ways in which it is officially recognized or condemned by power brokers rich in case studies from sacred centers throughout the world the contributions pay close attention to the ways in which pilgrims central authorities site managers locals and other stakeholders on the ground appropriate negotiate shape contest or circumvent the powerful forces of the sacred delving beyond the officially sacred this collective examination of pilgrimages both well established and new religious and secular authorized and not presents a compelling look at the interplay of secular powers and the transcendent forces of the sacred at these hyper meaningful sites providing a blueprint for how work in the anthropology and geography of religion and the fields of pilgrimage and religious tourism may move forward pilgrimage beyond the officially sacred will be of great interest to an interdisciplinary field of scholars the chapters were originally published as a special issue in tourism geographies

the remarkable growth in religious tourism across the world has generated considerable interest in the impacts of this type of tourism focusing here on environmental issues this book moves beyond the documentation of environmental impacts to examine in greater depth the intersections between religious tourism and the environment beginning with an in depth introduction that highlights the intersections between religion tourism and the environment the book then focuses on the environment as a resource or generator for religious tourism and as a recipient of the impacts of religious tourism chapters included discuss such important areas as theological views environmental responsibility and host perspectives

this book investigates spiritual tourism tourism characterised by an intentional search for spiritual benefit from a contemporary religious studies perspective using field research gathered from spiritual tourism locations in asia and europe and utilizing contemporary scholarship on practices concerned with meaning and identity it explores the phenomena of journeys that are taken for self transformation tracing the history of transformative ideas in western cultures of travel and including the modes in which the travel experience has been communicated spiritual tourism provides an important opportunity to comment on the role of tourism in contemporary conceptions of spirituality and spiritual practice in western society

this book brings together a range of case studies in the areas of religion religious tourism and pilgrimage in asia it assesses the increasing linkages and interconnections between religious tourism and secular spaces on a global stage and explores key learning points from a range of contemporary case studies of religious and pilgrimage activity related to ancient sacred and emerging tourist destinations new forms of pilgrimage faith systems and quasi religious activities the development and marketing of religious tourism are also addressed in a few chapters the book has 17 chapters a list of discussion questions and a subject index

this book explores the dynamic interaction between religion and tourism in the modern world it considers questions such as do travellers leave their religion at home when they are touring and what happens if not what are the

relationships between tourism and pilgrimage what happens to religious performances places and festivals that function as tourism attractions other chapters examine religious theme parks wellness and spa tourism the roles played by tourist guides guidebooks and religious souvenirs and the role of tourism as a major arena of religious encounters in the contemporary world surveying the growing body of work in the field michael stausberg argues that tourism should be a major focus of research within religious studies

the asia pacific region is considered the world's religious core with the greatest number of pilgrims and travellers for religious events for both international and domestic tourism it is estimated that there are approximately six hundred million national and international religious and spiritual voyages in the world of which 40 take place in europe and over half in asia according to unesco 60 of the world's population practises a religion and these believers form the demographic base of religious tourism this study has therefore clearly identified areas of interest that appeal to the religious aspects of travel and it is the responsibility of tourism administrators and travel professionals to glean this information and look at religious tourism as a resource in the same light as the sun sea and sand holidays that are readily marketed by tourism professionals

bringing together prominent scholars in the sociology of religion this collection of essays offers a framework for understanding the transition from the essentially penitential purposes of the medieval pilgrimage to the rise of the varied spiritualities of contemporary religious tourism covering over 1 500 years of religious travel these essays explore the forms of expression and experience which we must engage reflectively to better understand the idea of pilgrimage and religious tourism as an important aspect of religious affirmation this unique volume sheds light on the transformation of the traditional religious pilgrimage into a tourist activity and examines the influence of modern culture technology and secularization on spiritually motivated travel the editors conclude that a sharp distinction between pilgrimage and religious tourism is historically unjustified while the purposes of such travel have changed over time they remain a part of a larger religio cultural context offering avenues for religious encounter just as pilgrimage in earlier eras permitted the development of various secular dimensions covering such diverse topics as pagan pilgrimage and postmodern traditionalism medieval pilgrimage and disaster site visitation the authors provide an interesting look at an often misunderstood phenomenon

this collection of essays presents the very latest research on the peace building dimension of sacred and secular journeys at individual societal regional and global levels not since the 1980s has there been any concerted effort to explore the potential of such journeys in helping to bridge the divide that separates people of diverse ethnicities religions and cultures this volume gathers together empirical studies regional analyses and personal reflections from four continents and twelve countries including sri lanka syria ethiopia and indonesia which highlight the potential of religious tourism and pilgrimage for promoting interfaith solidarity natural dialogue and inner peace it will be of interest to religion tourism and peace scholars as well as to political scientists and anthropologists

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modern religious tourism is a main segment of the tourism business the main goal of religious tourism is aimed at developing human spirituality spiritual healing and culture where a person receives the experience of cooperation or involvement with the place in which he resides his people culture and religion this type of tourism is able to play a significant role in the overall goals of society and to promote the establishment of trusting relationships between people of all cultures and religions global development of religious tourism is a crucial reference book that contains research on the current religious situation as well as the tourism industry and provides insights on their joint development it is not possible to study any religious field without understanding the religion itself and its impact on any country s political and social system therefore the work also examines the impact of religion and tourism on economic and social developments across the world highlighting topics that include sanctuary cities religious tourism management and religious tourism in regions that span europe africa the middle east and more this book is targeted to managers executives planners and other professionals in the tourism and hospitality industry

government officials religious leaders and researchers academicians and students working in the fields of tourism management business management information and communication sciences administrative sciences and management education and social and political sciences

explores how religious travel in india is transforming religious identities and self constructions in an increasingly global world where convenient modes of travel have opened the door to international and intraregional tourism and brought together people from different religious and ethnic communities religious journeying in india has become the site of evolving and often paradoxical forms of self construction through ethnographic reflections the contributors to this volume explore religious and nonreligious motivations for religious travel in india and show how pilgrimages missionary travel the exportation of cultural art forms and leisure travel among coreligionists are transforming not only religious but also regional national transnational and personal identities the volume engages with central themes in south asian studies such as gender exile and spirituality a variety of religions including sikhism islam buddhism and christianity and understudied regions and emerging places of pilgrimage such as manipur and maharashtra it s rare to find such diverse accounts of religious travel collected in a single volume where scholars engagements with individual places of pilgrimage in india and with the journeys surrounding them are truly in conversation with one another for readers it makes for a deeply enlightening journey it also raises an interesting question is the reality of india powerful enough that it absorbs divergent expressions of religious tourism making of them a common fabric here so unusually readers have the materials to decide john stratton hawley author of a storm of songs india and the idea of the bhakti movement

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
