apollodoros who according to the platonic dialogues especially the symposium but also the memoirs of xenophon was such a close friend of socrates that he never left his side so i gave his wife the name of thaleia and created a discussion between her and xanthippe on the subject of socrates i put into their mouths details about the personality and philosophy of socrates which come from ancient texts in such a way as to make emerge the character and philosophy of xanthippe who according to xenophon was the most difficult of women
