poetry in trace peterson's first collection of poems since i moved in desire is the restless remainder of body subtracted from voice or maybe it's voice from body whitmanian in its quick and tender grandeur its penchant for direct address and its abstract kinkiness and longing since i moved in moves exorably from the transgendering non performance of trans figures to the startled suspended chiasm of spontaneous generation where at last the fetish body dispersed into landscape becomes simply an ambient mode of seeing or saying in a post everything ecology where voice broods over the face of the waters becoming the prosthetic body of the world tenney nathanson

wanting in arabic is a refusal of convenient silences convenient stories concerned with not covering the tracks of her own metamorphosis the author dwells in the contradictions of a transsexual poetics in this attendand disfigurations of lyric ghazal l'ecriture feininine and in particular her own sexed voice without a memory of her father's language the questions her poems ask are those for a home known through photographs for a language lost with childhood braiding theoretical concerns with the ambivalences of sexed and raced identity

with profound romanticism wanting in arabic attempts to travers the fantasies of foundational loss and aggressive nostalgia in order to further a poetics of a consious partiality of being of generous struggle and comic rather than tragic misrecongition

day break poet gwen benaway s fourth collection of work explores the everyday poetics of the trans feminine body through intimate experiences and conceptualizations of trans life day break asks what it means to be a trans woman both within the text and out in the physical world shifting between theory and poetry benaway questions how gender sexuality and love intersect with the violence and transmisogyny of the nation state and established literary institutions in beautiful lyric verse day break reveals the often unseen other worlds of trans life where body self and sex are transformed becoming more than fixed binary locations

poetry lgbt studies in gephymomania literally an addiction to or an obsession with bridges tolbert s choice isn t between female and male lover and self or loss and relief but rather to live willingly intentionally in the places where those binaries meet questions arise is a bridge simply an attempt to connect one seemingly stable body back to itself whose body which embodiment is absent when we say i miss you and who is adored when we say i love sensing the parallels between a lover who leaves and his own female body as it chooses as he chooses for it to recede the poems in gephymomania explore the spaces between among across and even within bodies

gender identity an issue that has galvanised the queer community in recent years goes beyond the nature of male female to a yet to be traversed region that lies somewhere between and beyond biologically determined gender in this groundbreaking anthology three experts in gender studies and politics navigate around rigid societally imposed concepts of two genders to discover and illuminate the limitless possibilities of identity

through lyric and language poetry this book explores and reimagines archives and histories of transsexuality and gender from psychoanalysis sexology literature anthropology and feminism as well as personal history
