what is development do the less developed countries of the world have any chance to become modern and developed what is the best path for a country to take towards development how do traditional societies evolve into more advanced societies of the type found in modern and developed countries the book attempts to answer all of these thought provoking questions i have been working in the sphere of international development for more than 15 years and have consulted different governments in europe asia and africa on the development issues each developing country in which i have worked is different and unique yet they share a significant number of common features peculiar to developing countries i want to emphasize one of them pessimism towards the prospects of country s development i came across this in my experiences in the low and middle income group countries whereby civil servants or the general population of those countries were very pessimistic of their respective country s development prospects one of the biggest drivers for this pessimism was limited knowledge with regards to two particular questions what is development and how do countries develop generally this issue is complicated by the fact that one needs some basic level knowledge of several interconnected disciplines to adequately answer these development field questions such as economics political science sociology geography demographics etc as a matter of fact the majority of books in the development field concentrate only on one or a few disciplines to provide viewpoints in
