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this book examines child abuse and neglect the latest research and laws what it entails and how to recognize and report it it considers up to date studies and methodology encourages discussions and debate and explains judicial rulings different forms of maltreatment physical abuse neglect psychological maltreatment sexual abuse fetal abuse and munchausen by proxy syndrome are explored as are resilience and prevention discussion questions a glossary and profiles of people actively working in the field are included this is an invaluable resource to workers who are mandated reporters of child maltreatment and or anyone interested in the problem

children and emotional abuse is a research informed learning resource for students in social work about the dynamics and consequences of psychological abuse especially as it occurs in dysfunctional families and affects children and adolescents emotional abuse is still not widely understood or recognized helping professionals need to recognize emotional abuse understand the damage it does the theories that account for it and be prepared to help children and families where the abuse often occurs along with physical and sexual abuse this text will draw upon current peer reviewed literature and evidence based studies and summarize essential information to prepare students for careers in helping professions each chapter will also contain brief vignettes to illustrate some of the key points this book is for courses in child welfare and child abuse neglect as well as other social work courses that focus on children

child abuse and neglect examines the latest research on this important topic discussing what it entails how to recognize it and how to report it the book begins with an overview of child maltreatment including its history a summary of the research and the risk factors before exploring issues of mandated reporting it then considers different forms of maltreatment physical abuse neglect psychological maltreatment sexual abuse fetal abuse and munchausen by proxy syndrome the authors discuss incidence estimates and consequences as well as resiliency for each type of maltreatment and then review legal issues including forensic interviewing the book concludes by providing an overview of what happens to a child after a report is filed along with suggestions for preventing child maltreatment this edition has been thoroughly updated throughout to cover the latest theory and research referencing the dsm v the book also features updated coverage of state and federal laws to reflect new legislation and additional case studies covering real world events such as the sexual abuse scandals within usa gymnastics the boy scouts of america and the southern baptist convention written with students in mind the book features a wealth of engaging learning tools throughout including theory highlight boxes focus on research boxes case examples legal examples focus on law boxes discussion questions and key terms it will be essential reading for all students taking courses on child abuse child maltreatment family violence or sexual and

as we near the 50th anniversary of the landmark article by c henry kempe and his colleagues entitled the battered child syndrome which ushered in the modern era of professional attention by pediatricians and other child health professionals we have reason for both celebration and concern we can take heart that over the recent ve decades a great deal of professional attention focused on the problem of child abuse and neglect in every state of the country there are mandatory reporting laws that require nurses physicians and social workers to report suspicions of maltreatment to the appropriate authorities for investigation the act of reporting provides legal immunity to the reporter except when performed in bad faith progress in understanding the factors that place children at risk for harm from ph ical abuse and neglect now permits prevention and intervention the peer reviewed literature dealing with child abuse and neglect has proliferated with high quality work being done and reported on the many dimensions related to the epidemi ogy mechanism treatment and prognosis of child maltreatment efforts are being directed toward developing an evidence based approach to the prevention of child abuse and neglect these are some of the positives however negatives exist and remain reasons for concern despite a tremendous amount of attention to the pr lem of maltreatment there are at least 3 million reports of suspected child abuse and neglect made annually with nearly 1 million cases being substantiated

this report presents results from the first nation wide study to examine the incidence of reported child maltreatment and the characteristics of children families investigated by canadian child welfare services incidence estimates presented in the report are based on a survey compiled by child welfare workers of a representative sample of child maltreatment investigations conducted in 1998 the introduction describes the rationale objectives of the survey provides an overview of the canadian child welfare system and reviews the definitional framework used for the study chapter 2 describes the study methodology and chapter 3 presents estimates of incidence of reported child maltreatment by category and level of substantiation chapter 4 examines the characteristics of these categories in terms of the nature severity and duration of injury and the identity of the alleged perpetrators investigation outcomes provision of services placement police involvement and applications to court are discussed in chapter 5 chapter 6 describes child characteristics including categories of maltreatment by age sex and by child functioning chapter 7 describes caregiver characteristics including age sex income income source housing and selected determinants of health referral agency characteristics are described in chapter 8 the final chapter summarizes key findings and outlines directions for further research appendices include a glossary copies of research forms used in the study case vignettes and tables showing variance estimates confidence levels
