understanding what family means and how best to support families depends on challenging politicized assumptions that frame ordinary families in comparison to an imagined problematic other learning from the perspectives of people who were in care in childhood this innovative book helps redefine the concept of family linking two longitudinal studies involving young adults

in england it reveals important new insights into the diverse and dynamic complexity of family lives identities and practices in time through childhood and beyond paving the way for future policy and practice this book makes an important contribution to the theorization of family in the 21st century

this practical accessible book encourages a deep often challenging consideration of how young children learn and how teachers and other adults best support their learning essential reading for education students it draws on research and practice to help readers reflect critically on their beliefs and practice after comparing different views of pedagogy it explores children s development and the importance of culture and context emphasising the attributes of successful learners relationships and the learning environment readers are helped think through how different aspects of pedagogy are interlinked and consider the implications for breadth balance planning and assessment and continuing professional development

thinking through confucius critically interprets the conceptual structure underlying confucius philosophical reflections it also investigates thinking or philosophy from the perspective of confucius perhaps the philosophical question of our time is what is philosophy the authors suggest that an examination of the chinese philosophy may provide an alternative definition of philosophy that can be used to address some of the pressing issues of the western cultural tradition this book finds an appropriate language for the interpretation of traditional chinese philosophical thought a language which is relatively free from the bias and presuppositions of western philosophy

thinking through kierkegaard is a critical evaluation of s ren kierkegaard s vision of the normatively human of who we are and might aspire to become and of what mehl calls our existential identity through a pragmatist examination of three of kierkegaard s key pseudonymous voices judge william climacus and anti climacus peter j mehl argues that kierkegaard s path is not the only end of our search but instead leads us to affirm a plurality of paths toward a fulfilling existential identity contrary to kierkegaard s ideal of moral personhood and orthodox christian identity mehl aims to acknowledge the possibility of pluralism in existential identities by demanding sensitivity to the deep ways social and cultural context influences human perception interpretation and self representation mehl argues that kierkegaard is not simply discovering but also participating in a cultural construction of the human being

drawing on accounts of what it is to be a person by prominent philosophers outside of kierkegaard scholarship including charles taylor owen flanagan alasdair macintyre and thomas nagel mehl also works to bridge the analytic and continental traditions and reestablishes kierkegaard as a rich resource for situating moral and spiritual identity this reexamination of kierkegaard is recommended for anyone interested in what it means to be a person

contemporary debates on god s emotionality are divided between two extremes impassibilists deny god s emotionality on the basis of god s omniscience omnipotence and incorporeality passibilists seem to break with tradition by affirming divine emotionality often focusing on the idea that god suffers with us contemporary philosophy of emotion reflects this divide some philosophers argue that emotions are voluntary and intelligent mental events making them potentially compatible with omniscience and omnipotence others claim that emotions are involuntary and basically physiological rendering them inconsistent with traditional divine attributes thinking through feeling god emotion and passibility creates a three way conversation between the debate in theology contemporary philosophy of emotion and pre modern particularly augustinian and thomist conceptions of human affective experience it also provides an exploration of the intelligence and value of the emotions of compassion anger and jealousy

this broad ranging and thought provoking set of readings stresses the diversity of responses in the way the natural environment has been understood and questioned in the modern world

what is style and how does it relate to thought in language it has often been treated as something merely linguistic independent of thought ornamental stylishness for its own sake or else it has been said to subserve thought by mimicking delineating or heightening ideas that are already expressed in the words this ambitious and timely book explores a third more radical possibility in which style operates as a verbal mode of thinking through rather than figure thought as primary and pre verbal and language as a secondary delivery system style is conceived here as having the capacity to clarify or generate thinking the book s generic focus is on non fiction prose and it looks across the long nineteenth century leading scholars survey twenty authors to show where writers who have gained reputations as either stylists or as thinkers exploit the interplay between the what and the how of their prose the study demonstrates how celebrated stylists might after all have thoughts worth attending to and that distinguished thinkers might be enriched for us if we paid more due to their style more than reversing the conventional categories this innovative volume shows how style and thinking can be approached as a shared concern at a moment when especially in nineteenth century studies

interest in style is re emerging this book reevaluates some of the most influential figures of that age re imagining the possible alliances interplays and generative tensions between thinking thinkers style and stylists

bovine tuberculosis is seriously damaging the uk dairy and beef industry many farmers believe culling badgers must be part of the solution but in 2013 a record 300 000 people signed a downing street petition asking the government to stop planned culls of badgers in somerset and gloucestershire fuelling media controversy and signalling the beginning of a social conflict that was acted out in studios streets fields and village halls across england the four year trial culls which began that year aimed to establish that culling was a viable way of tackling the disease but the widely divergent experiences and values of policy makers farming conservation and animal welfare supporters means that decades of science on the disease in badgers and the effects of culling has not helped resolve the dispute reporting on original uk research council funded social science this book takes on the challenge of understanding the contrasting views involved listening carefully to what the different protagonists have to say the book unpicks the way science is interpreted to sustain differing conclusions and considers how social science thinking could contribute the book develops a critical perspective on the increasingly important literature influenced by new materialism the social science response to the science wars and explores the extent to which a social movement around opposition to the culls is emerging in approachable prose this access all areas account describes the struggle to develop understanding through the messy process of research and the difficulties of scientific analysis and philosophical thought as such it provides a valuable resource for both research practitioners and teachers within the social sciences as well as an accessible way for biological scientists conservationists and farmers to reflect on the issues around the management of disease in livestock and wildlife

use your imagination the demand is as important as it is confusing what is the imagination what is its value where does it come from and where is it going in a time when even the obscene seems overdone and passé this book takes up these questions and argues for the centrality of imagination in human cognition it traces the development of the imagination in Kant's critical philosophy particularly the critique of aesthetic judgment and claims that the insights of Kantian aesthetic theory especially concerning the nature of creativity common sense and genius influenced the development of nineteenth century American philosophy the book identifies the central role of the imagination in the philosophy of Peirce a role often overlooked in analytic treatments of his thought the final chapters pursue the observation made by Kant and Peirce that imaginative genius is a type of natural gift ingenium and must in some way be continuous with the creative force of nature it makes this final turn by way of contemporary studies of metaphor embodied cognition and cognitive neuroscience

with the publication of *The Seven Storey Mountain* in 1948 Thomas Merton became a bestselling author writing about spiritual contemplation in a modern context although Merton 1915–1968 lived as a Trappist monk he advocated a spiritual life that was not a retreat from the world but an alternative to it particularly to the deadening materialism and spiritual vacuity of the postwar west over the next twenty years Merton wrote for a wide audience bringing the wisdom of Christianity Buddhism and Sufism into dialogue with the period's contemporary thought in *Thinking Through Thomas Merton* Robert Inchausti introduces readers to Merton and evaluates his continuing relevance for our time Inchausti shows how Merton broke the high modernist trance so that we might become the change we wish to see in the world by refiguring the lost virtues of silence contemplation and community in a world enamored by the will to power virtuoso

performance radical skepticism and materialist metaphysics merton's defense of contemplative culture is considered in light of the postmodern thought of recent years and emerges as a compelling alternative
