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this edited collection brings together contemporary research that uses corpus linguistics to carry out discourse analysis the book takes an inclusive view of the meaning of discourse covering different text types or modes of language including discourse as both social practice and as ideology or representation

examines approaches to carrying out discourse analysis da using techniques that are grounded in corpus linguistics this book

evaluates a variety of corpus based methodologies including collocations keyness concordances dispersion plots and building and annotating corpora

how can you carry out discourse analysis using corpus linguistics what research questions should i ask which methods should you use and when what is a collocational network or a key cluster introducing the major techniques methods and tools for corpus assisted analysis of discourse this book answers these questions and more showing readers how to best use corpora in their analyses of discourse using carefully tailored case studies each chapter is devoted to a central technique including frequency concordancing and keywords going step by step through the process of applying different analytical procedures introducing a wide range of different corpora from holiday brochures to political debates the book considers the key debates and latest advances in the field fully revised and updated this new edition includes a new chapter on how to conduct research projects in corpus based discourse analysis completely rewritten chapters on collocation and advanced techniques using a corpus of jihadist propaganda texts and covering topics such as social media and visual analysis coverage of major tools including cqpweb antconc sketch engine and lancsbox discussion of newer techniques including the derivation of lockwords and the comparison of multiple data sets for diachronic analysis with exercises discussion questions and suggested further readings in each chapter this book is an excellent guide to using corpus linguistics techniques to carry out discourse analysis

this book brings together contributions from a diverse collection of scholars who explore different ways of combining corpus linguistics and discourse analysis studying discourse at the prosodic lexical and textual levels both spoken and written discourse are investigated in a variety of settings including academia the workplace news and entertainment not only does the volume offer a rich sample of english language discourse from around the world including international learner and non standard varieties of english but it also covers a range of topics and methods this book will be of particular interest to researchers and students specializing in discourse studies english linguistics and corpus linguistics

corpus linguistics has made impressive strides in the fields of lexicography and grammatical description but has had relatively little to say as yet in describing features of discourse this volume then examines how it is possible to use concordance technology and the detailed linguistic evidence available in corpora to enhance the study of among other things how speakers writers organise their discourse how they express evaluation of their topics and the rhetorical strategies they employ to persuade an audience particular attention is paid to interrogating specialized corpora and to devising techniques to discover

what is going on between speakers and between authors and readers in particular varieties of the language these studies reveal the value of integrating corpus techniques with other non automatic methods of research into the linguistic record and of combining quantitative and qualitative approaches in general they show how it is possible to use corpora to analyse discourse not only as product but also as process

considerable progress has been made in the use of corpora for research purposes to describe language in use and more recently through a corpus assisted discourse studies approach to identify the discourse features of specific text genres while the potential benefits of working with corpora in the classroom have been recognised there has been a lag in the promulgation of guidelines for carrying out meaningful corpus work with language learners and teachers in mind the papers in this volume aim to make a contribution toward filling that gap by providing an in depth account of innovative corpus work most of which has actually been carried out with real learners in the classroom authors provide valuable insights into ways of structuring corpus work for specific target learners as well as suggestions for resolving problematic issues that have arisen and avoiding errors that have been made with learners and in their own research and experimentation the transparency and honesty with which they present their methodology and results along with the successful techniques they have developed constitute a step forward in defining good and bad practice in the use of corpora in learning

john sinclair is one of the major figures in applied linguistics and his work is essential study for students this accessible book collects in one volume sinclair's key papers on written discourse structure lexis patterns phraseology corpus analysis lexicography and linguistic theory from the 1990s all the papers have been edited and updated for this book the clear and accessible introduction helps students to navigate his key themes and arguments making the volume an ideal companion for those coming to sinclair's more recent writings for the first time

the breadth and spread of corpus assisted discourse studies cads indicate its usefulness for exploring language use within a social context however its theoretical foundations limitations and epistemological implications must be considered so that we can adjust our research designs accordingly this element offers a compact guide to which corpus linguistic tools are available and how they can contribute to finding out more about discourse it will appeal to researchers both new and experienced within the cads community and beyond

corpus linguistics has had a revolutionary impact on grammar and discourse research not only has it opened up entirely new theoretical perspectives and methodological possibilities for both fields but it has also to a considerable extent erased the boundaries that have traditionally been drawn between them this book showcases a variety of current corpus based approaches to the study of grammar and discourse and makes a case for seeing grammar and discourse as fundamentally inter related phenomena the book features contributions from leading experts in cognitive linguistics construction grammar critical discourse studies genre and register analysis phraseology language learning and teaching languages for specific purposes second language acquisition sociolinguistics systemic functional linguistics and text linguistics an essential reference point for future research corpora grammar and discourse has been edited in honour of susan hunston whose own work has consistently pushed at the boundaries of corpus based research on grammar and discourse for over three decades

corpus linguistics uses specialist software to identify linguistic patterns in large computerised collections of text patterns which then must be interpreted and explained by human researchers this book critically explores how corpus linguistics techniques can help analysis of language and gender by conducting a number of case studies on topics which include directives in spoken conversations changes in sexist and non sexist language use over time personal adverts press representation of gay men and the ways that boys and girls are constructed through language the book thus covers both gendered usage e g how do males and females use language differently or not from each other and gendered representations e g in what ways are males and females written or spoken about additionally the book shows ways that readers can either explore their own hypotheses or approach the corpus from a naïve position letting the data drive their analysis from the outset the book covers a range of techniques and measures including frequencies keywords collocations dispersion word sketches downsizing and triangulation all in an accessible style

this book brings together a number of empirical studies that use corpora to study discourse patterns in speech and writing it explores new trends in the area of text and discourse characterized by the alliance between text linguistics and areas such as corpus linguistics genre analysis literary stylistics and cross linguistic studies the contributions to the volume show how established corpora can be used to ask a number of new questions about the interface between speech and writing the relation between grammar and discourse academic discourse cohesive markers stylistic devices such as metaphor deixis and non verbal communication the corpora used for text analysis can also be tailor made for the study of particular genres such as journal article abstracts lectures e mailing list messages headlines and titles a recent development is to bring in contrastive

data from bilingual corpora to show what is language specific in the organization of the text

karin aijmer professor of english at the university of gothenburg in the years 1996 2006 is well known within the linguistic community especially by virtue of her pioneering research within the domain of pragmatics in a broad sense where her work in conversation and discourse analysis has played a particularly prominent role in this volume a large number of karin aijmer's wide network of friends and colleagues pay linguistic tribute each in their own way to her untiring exploration of some of the mysteries or miracles of ordinary down to earth communication a fair share of the papers in this festschrift deal with subject matter that is close to her heart making frequent reference to her work others provide different perspectives shedding light on some other areas of language and linguistics

this book explores discourse mainly through corpus linguistics methods indeed corpus assisted discourse studies has become a widely used approach for the critical or non critical analysis of discourses in recent times the book focuses on the analysis of different kinds of discourse but most particularly on those which attempt to unveil social attitudes and values although a corpus methodology is deemed crucial in all research found here it should not be inferred that a single uniform technique is applied but a wide variety of them often shaped by the software which has been used also more than one qualitative or quantitative methodology or drawing from various relevant sources is often called for in the critical analysis of discourses

this collection sheds light on the ways in which corpus linguistics and the use of learner corpora might be applied to the study of academic discourse revealing linguistic and rhetorical patterns and insights into variation across a range of disciplinary genres organized into three sections the book highlights key tools and methodologies in corpus analysis to study such features as discourse markers lexical bundles linguistic complexity lexico grammatical conventions and modality in case studies in studies of academic discourse both in a second language and in english for specific purposes the volume features examples from disciplinary genres not often covered in the existing literature including ma theses academic book reviews and online student forums taken together with the study of learner corpora the book demonstrates the impact of corpus linguistic tools in better understanding linguistic patterns of specific languages and language use and in turn their role in helping to identify the needs of language learners the book will be of interest to students and scholars in corpus linguistics applied linguistics and english for specific purposes

corpus linguistics has now come of age and corpus approaches to discourse equips students with the means to question defend and refine the methodology looking at corpus linguistics in discourse research from a critical perspective this volume is a call for greater reflexivity in the field the chapters each written by leading authorities contain an overview of an emerging area and a case study presenting practical advice alongside theoretical reflection carefully structured with an introduction by the editors and a conclusion by leading researcher paul baker this is key reading for advanced students and researchers of corpus linguistics and discourse analysis

corpus and context explores the relationship between corpus linguistics and pragmatics by discussing possible frameworks for analysing utterance function on the basis of spoken corpora the book articulates the challenges and opportunities associated with a change of focus in corpus research from lexical to functional units from concordance lines to extended stretches of discourse and from the purely textual to multi modal analysis of spoken corpus data drawing on a number of spoken corpora including the five million word cambridge and nottingham corpus of discourse in english cancode funded by cup c a specific speech act function is being explored using different approaches and different levels of analysis this involves a close analysis of contextual variables in relation to lexico grammatical and discoursal patterns that emerge from the corpus data as well as a wider discussion of the role of context in spoken corpus research

analysing representation a corpus and discourse textbook guides readers through the process of researching how people and phenomena are represented in discourse and introduces them to key tools they can use from corpus linguistics and critical discourse analysis this book takes a step by step approach to introducing each concept and includes exercises and further reading to help readers check their progress and prepare for independent research it is unique in introducing readers to a range of experts representing the full range of work in this area this book is aimed at final year undergraduate taught postgraduate and doctoral level students it wil also be useful to scholars who are new to combining corpus and discourse methods in investigations of representation

this book explores the structure and use of academic and professional discourse through the lens of corpus linguistics the goal of this book is to show how insights from corpus linguistic analyses can help us better understand how we use academic and professional language and help us find ways to better train newcomers to the genres used in various professional contexts the contributions to this book show that specialized corpora of specific genres from a variety of fields allow us to make more

relevant observations about the function and use of language for particular purposes the specialized corpora examined include written and spoken academic genres written and spoken business and legal genres and written philanthropic genres the book showcases a variety of approaches to analyzing the discourse of specialized corpora and each chapter concludes with a reflection on the practical and pedagogical implications of the analysis

discourse on the move is the first book length exploration of how corpus based methods can be used for discourse analysis applied to the description of discourse organization the primary goal is to bring these two analytical perspectives together undertaking a detailed discourse analysis of each individual text but doing so in terms that can be generalized across all texts of a corpus the book explores two major approaches to this task top down and bottom up in the top down approach the functional components of a genre are determined first and then all texts in a corpus are analyzed in terms of those components in contrast textual components emerge from the corpus analysis in the bottom up approach and the discourse organization of individual texts is then analyzed in terms of linguistically defined textual categories both approaches are illustrated through case studies of discourse structure in particular genres fund raising letters biology biochemistry research articles and university classroom teaching

this volume presents current state of the art discussions in corpus based linguistic research of the english language the papers deal with present day english worldwide varieties of english and the history of the english language a special focus of the volume are studies in the broad field of corpus pragmatics and corpus based discourse analysis it includes corpus based studies of speech acts conversational routines referential expressions and thought styles as well as studies on the lexis grammar and semantics of english and it also includes several studies on technical aspects of corpus compilation fieldwork and parsing

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
