in utopia more paints a vision of the customs and practices of a distant island but utopia means no place and his narrator s name hythlodæus translates as dispenser of nonsense this fantastical tale masks what is a serious and subversive analysis of the failings of more s society advocating instead a world in which there is religious tolerance

provision for the aged and state ownership of land utopia has been variously claimed as a catholic tract or an argument for communism and it still invites each generation to make its own interpretation
