children's literature and intergenerational relationships encounters of the playful kind explores ways in which children's literature becomes the object and catalyst of play that brings younger and older generations closer to one another providing examples from diverse cultural and historical contexts this collection argues that children's texts promote intergenerational play through the use of literary devices and graphic formats and that they may prompt joint play practices in the real world the book offers a distinctive contribution to children's literature scholarship by shifting critical attention away from the difference and conflict between children and adults to the exploration of inter age interdependencies as equally crucial aspects of human life presenting a new perspective for all who research and work with children's culture in times of global aging

mastering fear analyzes horror as play and examines what functions horror has and why it is adaptive and beneficial for audiences it takes a biocultural approach and focusing on emotions gender and play it argues we play with fiction horror in horror we engage not only with the negative emotions of fear and disgust but with a wide range of emotions both positive and negative the book lays out a new theory of horror and analyzes female protagonists in contemporary horror from child to teen adult middle age and old age since the turn of the millennium we have seen a new generation of female protagonists in horror there are feisty teens in the vampire diaries 2009 2017 troubled mothers in the babadook 2014 and struggling women in the new french extremity with martyrs 2008 and inside 2007 at the fuzzy edges of the genre are dramas like pan's labyrinth 2006 and black swan 2010 and middle age women are now protagonists with carol in the walking dead 2010 and jessica lange's characters in american horror story 2011 horror is not just for men but also for women and not just for the young but for audiences of all ages

something exciting is happening with the contemporary history play new writing by playwrights such as jackie sibblies drury samuel adamson hannah khalil cordelia lynn and lucy kirkwood makes powerful theatrical use of the past but does not fit into critics familiar categories of historical drama in this book benjamin poore provides readers with tools to name and critically analyse these changes the contemporary history play contends that many history plays are becoming more complex and layered in their aesthetic approaches as playwrights work through the experience of being surrounded by numerous and varied forms of historical representation in the twenty first century for theatre scholars this book offers a means of interpreting how new writing relies on the past and notions of historicity to generate meaning and resonance in the present for playwrights and students of playwriting the book is a guide to the history play s recent past and to the state of the art what techniques and formulas have been popular the tropes that are widely used and how artists have found ways of renewing or overturning established conventions

reading shakespeare through drama arises out of case study research which focuses on reading as a socio cultural practice underpinned by theories of reading learning drama and play it is nevertheless rooted in the everyday work of secondary english classrooms utilising the dialogic ambiguities inherent in shakespeare s playscripts this collaborative approach to reading pays particular attention to adolescent readers as meaning makers and cultural producers the authors examine different iterations of active shakespeare pedagogies in the uk the usa and australia drawing a distinction between

reading through drama as an approach and the theatre inflected practices promoted by well known arts based institutions observational and interview data highlight the importance of addressing issues concerning identity and representation that are inevitably raised by the study of canonical literature importantly this element situates teachers practice within broader ideological contexts at institutional and national policy level particularly from the perspective of england s highly regulated system of schooling

scripts of blackness shows how the early modern mass media of theatre and performance culture at large helped turn blackness into a racial category that is into a type of difference justifying emerging social hierarchies and power relations in a new world order driven by colonialism and capitalism in this book noémie ndiaye explores the techniques of impersonation used by white performers to represent afro diasporic people in england france and spain in the sixteenth and seventeenth centuries using a comparative and transnational framework she reconstructs three specific performance techniques black up cosmetic blackness blackspeak acoustic blackness and black dances kinetic blackness in order to map out the poetics of those

techniques and track a number of metaphorical strains that early modern playtexts regularly associated with them those metaphorical strains the titular scripts of blackness of this book operated across national borders and constituted resources as they provided spectators and participants with new ways of thinking about the afro diasporic people who lived or could would ultimately live in their midst those scripts were often gendered and hinged on notions of demonization exclusion exploitation animalization commodification sexualization consensual enslavement misogynoir infantilization and evocative association with other racialized minorities scripts of blackness attempts to grasp the stories that western europeans told themselves through performative blackness and the effects of those fictions on early modern afro diasporic subjects
