just in a single chapter secondly research to evaluate practice while still the focus of the last two chapters is discussed alongside research for building a professional knowledge base at many points throughout the text third discussion of ethical issues appears in many other places besides chapter 2 it receives special emphasis in the discussions of program evaluations and single system research
