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in our daily lives we make lots of evaluations of actions we think that driving above the speed limit is dangerous that giving up one s bus seat to the elderly is polite that stirring eggs with a plastic spoon is neither good nor bad we understand too that we may be praised or blamed for actions performed on the basis of these evaluations the goal of this study is to illustrate the foundations that allow for these kinds of judgments

foundations of ethics a critical reader in moral and social philosophy aims at stimulating and encouraging the reader to undertake better philosophical thinking about ethical questions the book is divided into three parts part one takes the student through an exploration of some basic moral terms concepts principles and views part two is devoted to two ethical theories teleology and deontology while part three enunciates and discusses rule utilitarianism a third ethical theory the book will appeal to undergraduate students of philosophy in general and those of ethics in particular students of law sociology political science religious studies and the general public should find it a useful companion because of its multidisciplinary approach a review exercise is included at the end of the text to assist the student test his her understanding of the concepts and issues discussed

intended for philosophically minded psychologists and psychologically minded philosophers this book identifies the ways that psychology has hobbled itself by adhering too strictly to empiricism this being the doctrine that all knowledge is observation based in the first part of this two part work we show that empiricism is false in the second part we identify the psychology relevant consequences of this fact five of these are of special importance i whereas some psychopathologies e g obsessive compulsive disorder corrupt the activity mediated by one s psychological architecture others e g sociopathy corrupt that architecture itself ii the basic tenets of psychoanalysis are coherent iii all propositional attitudes are beliefs iv selves are minds that self evaluate and v it is by giving our thoughts a perceptible form that we enable ourselves to evaluate them and it is by expressing ourselves in language and art that we give our thoughts a perceptible form series a

foundationalism as a theory of justification and knowledge is often associated with enlightenment rationality the cartesian thirst for certainty and the modern assumption of

the objectivity and universality of reason because of these associations scholars in various fields have disdained foundationalism in favor of some sort of non foundationalist post modern approach to knowledge and justification this present book is one piece of a much wider conversation that hopes to motivate a renewed look at foundationalism of course the foundationalism on offer has settled down quite a bit from its surly forbears this more mild mannered foundationalism suggests that our beliefs about reality can be held with confidence and yet these beliefs remain open to criticism and revision it is this type of epistemology that provides a constructive basis for investigation and research while nevertheless encouraging a cognitive humility about our claims to possess truth

technology but also a broader community and societal issue get an historical overview of advertising propaganda disinformation misinformation and illiteracy gain knowledge of both applied strategies for working with individuals and for addressing the issues in community contexts find methods for combating urgent societal ills caused and exacerbated by misinformation and get tools and techniques for advocacy activism and self reflection throughout one s career
