latin america has been an important place for architecture for many decades masters like barragán dieste lina bo bardi and niemeyer pointed the way for architectural design all over the world and they continue to do so today their approach to colors materials and walls had a deep and lasting influence on architectural modernism since then however and especially in the last fifteen years architecture on the continent has continued to evolve and a lively and extremely creative architecture scene has developed the work of latin american architects and city planners is often guided by social issues for example the approach to informal settlements on the outskirts of big cities the scarcity of housing and public space the availability of affordable transportation and the important role of cultural infrastructure such as schools libraries and sports facilities as a catalyst for neighborhoods within this context the book considers numerous projects that have prompted discussion and provided fresh impetus all across latin america outstanding projects like the santo domingo library in medellin colombia by giancarlo mazzanti alberto kalach's liceo franco mexicano in mexico and the works of alejandro aravena in chile show that recent latin american architecture is more than capable of holding its own beside the works of the founders felipe hernández is an architect and professor of architectural design history and theory at the university of liverpool he attended an ma in architecture and critical theory graduating with distinction in 1998 and received his phd from the university of nottingham in 2003 he has taught at the bartlett school of architecture ucl the universities of nottingham sheffield east london and nottingham trent in the united kingdom as well as at brown university and roger williams university in usa felipe has published numerous essays and articles examining the situation of contemporary latin american cities and revealing the multiplicity of architectural practices that operate simultaneously in the constant re shaping of the continent's cities

abstract this dissertation explores the writing of history through the close reading of william j r curtis's *Modern Architecture* since 1900 1982 curtis's book lies in a transitional period in the history of modern architecture between the establishment of research degrees in north american schools in the 1970s and the consolidation of the discipline as the subject matter of historiographical research in the 1990s these developments culminated in

1999 with a major methodological reassessment of the history of modern architecture its education and its scholarly study in journals such as *JSAH* and *JAE* the study of postcolonial theories in architecture also at the turn of the century challenged the previously accepted canon of architectural history by urging the development of a global history of architecture which remains today undefined curtis worked on the first edition as a young researcher in north america in the late 1970s and on the definitive edition of the book in the early 1990s modern architecture since 1900 is exemplary of and contemporary to these developments

this book examines the relationship between modern sculpture and architecture in the mid twentieth century an interplay that has laid the ground for the semi sculptural or semi architectural works by architects such as frank gehry and artists such as dan graham the first half of the book looks at how the addition of sculpture enhanced several architectural projects including mies van der rohe's barcelona pavilion 1929 and eliel saarinen's cranbrook campus 1934 the second half of the book uses several additional case studies including philip johnson's sculpture court for new york's museum of modern art 1953 to explore what architectural spaces can add to the sculpture they are designed to contain curtis argues that it was in the middle of the twentieth century before sculptural and architectural forms began to converge that the complementary nature of though essential difference between the two art forms began to clearly emerge how figurative sculpture highlighted the modernist architectural experience and how the abstract qualities of that architecture imparted to sculpture a heightened role

following in the footsteps of boston bohemia 1881 1900 douglass shand tucci s widely praised portrait of ralph adams cram s early years this volume tells the story of cram s later career as one of america s leading cultural figures and most accomplished architects with his partner bertram goodhue cram won a number of important commissions beginning with the west point competition in 1903 although an increasingly bitter rivalry with goodhue would lead to the dissolution of their partnership in 1912 cram had already begun to strike out on his own supervising architect at princeton consulting architect at wellesley and head of the mit school of architecture he would also design most of new york s cathedral of st john the divine and the campus of rice university as well as important church and collegiate structures throughout the country by the 1920s cram had become a household name even appearing on the cover of time magazine a complex man cram was a leading figure in what shand tucci calls a full fledged homosexual monastery in england while at the same time married to elizabeth read their relationship was a complicated one the effect of which on his children and his career is explored fully in this book so too is his work as a religious leader and social theorist shand tucci traces the influence on cram of such disparate figures as franklin delano roosevelt phillips brooks henry adams and ayn rand he divides cram s career into four lifelong quests medieval modernist american and ecumenical some quests may have failed but in each he left a considerable legacy ultimately transforming the visual image of american christianity in the twentieth century handsomely illustrated with over 130 photographs and drawings and eight pages of color plates ralph adams cram can be read on its own or in conjunction with boston bohemia 1881 1900 together the two volumes complete what the christian century has described as a superbly researched and captivating biography

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
