of thought that on the surface seem to differ only about the interpretation of historical facts while previous accounts have treated the study of the founding as the sequential replacement of one paradigm by another gibson argues that all of these interpretations survive as alternative and still viable approaches each has simultaneously illuminated and masked core truths about the american founding he renders a balanced account of the current debate over the origins and foundations of the american republic and offers solid footing on the path to understanding the vast literature devoted to this important subject
