the wechsler intelligence scale for children fourth edition wisc iv is one of the most often used measures to assess intelligence and cognitive functions in children ages 6 16 years the second edition of the wisc iv clinical assessment and intervention will include new information obtained from the clinical use of the wisc iv in practice information on the basic use of the assessment tool is condensed from three chapters into one with four new chapters discussing how to use and interpret wisc iv with additional clinical populations these new populations include pervasive developmental disorders including autism social and emotional disorders psychiatric disorders and medical disorders that may affect intelligence an additional new chapter discusses intervention planning across patient populations each of the chapters revised original chapters and new chapters will additionally include case studies including diagnosis
